## **Project Description:**

The proposed Ceduna Marina development will be located on the Northern outskirts of Ceduna and will be centred on a commercial marina and wharf facility to assist and encourage future growth within the region's fishing and aquaculture industry.

Consisting of approximately 1000 residential and tourism accommodation waterfront allotments the development will also provide both residential housing, apartments and resort style accommodation. Cultural, recreational and leisure facilities, including an interpretive centre, tourism facilities and retail opportunities are also planned for this project.

This project has had the Major Project Status extended for a further twelve months until December 2011, and the development provides the opportunity for Ceduna to be a major focus for economic development, and social and recreational outcomes for the Far West Coast region of South Australia.

To progress the success of the project, the developers are assessing opportunities for project partners and investors to become involved in this project.

## **Benefits:**

The project has significant social and economic benefits for the Ceduna township and region. It offers a unique waterfront lifestyle for residential living which will support the existing and future fishing and aquaculture industries.

During the construction phase alone, it is anticipated that over 100 jobs will be created providing positive employment opportunities and an economic boost to the local economy.
